Gardet was established in 1895 by Charles Gardet in Chiqny-Les-Roses, in the heart of the Montagne de Reims. In the 1930's Georges Gardet, son of Charles, moved in to a Belle Epoque residence with a precise aim - to develop the Gardet name whilst continuing to produce wines of impeccable quality.

In 2007 the Prieux family took control of the reins, taking this fine Champagne House to another level. With 5 ha of Premier Cru vineyards around their home village of Chigny-Les-Roses, this is a highly reputable producer with a superb range of Champagnes.

Following Head Chef Tom's visit to Champagne Gardet in August, we have chosen to solely list the Gardet range over other Grande Marques as we feel a personal connection, having met the family and seen their expertise, commitment and outstanding quality.
